Photography West Friday Meeting Programs

The following are guidelines for submitting programs to be viewed at the Stardust Theatre on Fridays:

- Shows must be photographed by the club member presenting. No purchased videos or slides.
- Other sourced material from Google, for example, may be used to illustrate your story, such as a map or before and after photos. When using other sources be sure to credit them.
- Credit must also be given to the music applied to the production.
- Shows are to be scheduled through the Friday program chairperson.
- Shows must be produced for showing on standard Windows PC or Blu-Ray/DVD player

Programs can be produced on a variety of software; some recommended software:

For Windows users:

- Proshow Gold or Proshow Producer
- MySlideShow Gold
- Windows Movie Maker
- Microsoft PowerPoint
- Cyberlink PowerDirector
- Adobe Premiere/Premiere Elements

For Mac users:

- IPhoto
- IMovie

Usually, the Friday Program will consist of one "long" program and one "short" program. A "long" program can be up to 25 minutes in length. A "short" program can be up to 10 minutes in length. At the sole discretion of the Friday Program chair several "short" programs can be combined, and one long program can be extending 10 minutes in length if no "short" program is scheduled.

Projection equipment used in the Stardust Theater is capable of displaying full High-Definition images. For your show to look its best you should select the highest resolution when finalizing your production. Shows should be submitted on a USB memory stick (MP4 format or .exe file) or burned to a DVD or BLU-RAY disk.

It is recommended that you either create a title menu OR have 3-5 seconds of black at the beginning of your program.

NOTE: To ensure programs will project correctly at the theater, it is highly recommended that you submit your show to the projectionist a week prior to the showing date.
